Town of Weston Web Site

Road Projects

The town applied for three grants last fall. We received one to help in rebuilding Kramer Lane in 2021. We did not receive the grant for rebuilding Ross Ave and are still waiting to find out about the project to rebuild Gusman Road.

Spring Bulk-Item Drop-Off

The annual Village and Town of Weston **Spring Bulk-Item Drop-Off** is set to occur Thursday, May 14th, from 8am-4pm, Friday, May 15th, from 8am-4pm, and Saturday, May 16th, 8am-2pm, and to be held again at Advanced Disposal Services, located at 5509 Fuller Street.

The items that will be accepted include: **Non-Metal Items,** *Furniture, Carpeting, Scrap Lumber, Mattresses, and Glass Windows*. Please be aware that address verification will be required, and we may be limiting residents to 2 or 3 trips.

Please be aware that only residential properties that pay the annual refuse and recycling service fee on their tax bill are eligible for this service. If you are unsure if your property qualifies, please call 715-359-6114.

Town Walking Path

The town has completed a walking path in the Home Sweet Home subdivision. The trail is on the corner of Whispering Pine and Easter St. and goes over to Hawthorne Lane. The town already owned the right of way and we used our parkland dedication fee money to construct the trail.

I would like to thank those that helped in making this possible. County Concrete donated the bin blocks that were used to support the bridge in order to cross the wet land. The gravel for the trail was donated by Jim Wanserski, Vistas at Greenwood Hills. Salzman Trucking donated the precast concrete, staff and equipment to move the concrete and gravel. Braiden Hall organized the Boy Scouts and leaders to clear the brush, and level the gravel, and constructed the railing. Braiden has earned his Eagle Scout badge with the completing of this walking path.



Absentee Voting


Any voter who prefers to vote by absentee ballot may request one by mail, email, or fax. Please visit www. gab.wi.gov/voters/absentee for more information.

Voter Registration

• Online during open registration (20 days or more prior to an election) at https://myvote.wi.gov. Must have a current and valid Wisconsin Driver License or Wisconsin State ID card. • By mail during open registration (20 days or more prior to an election). • In the Clerk's office (up until the Friday before the election by appointment only). • In person at your voting location (on Election Day). You MUST provide proof of residency when registering to vote by mail, in the Clerk's office, or at your voting location. To see which documents are acceptable for proof of residency, please visit https://elections.wi.gov/publications/voter-guides/proof-of-residence.

Photo ID Required to Vote

If you have a photo ID, please visit bringit.wi.gov/ do-i-have-right-photo-id to check if it's an acceptable form of ID. If you do not have a photo ID, you can get a Wisconsin State ID card free. Visit bringit.wi.gov/how-do-i-getfree-state-id-card for details.
