NEVER EVER place the following in your recycling cart:

- Garbage
- Plastic bags or film
- Grease-soaked or soiled paper products
- Large plastic items
- Batteries, light bulbs, or waste oil
- Household hazardous waste

REMINDER: The yard-waste site is located at 8200 Ryan Street, Weston, or you can contact Advanced Disposal for a dedicated yard-waste recycling cart (at a cost). CORRECTION TO 2020 RECYCLING CALENDAR Following the publication of the 2020 Refuse/ Recycling Newsletter, which you would have received in the mail around the 2nd week of January, it was noticed there was an error on the Recycling Calendar (June and November recycling weeks). Electronics Recycling Event

The crew from <u>RecycleThatStuff.com</u> will be on site to collect your unwanted electronics, ranging from a small toaster to large TV's. Most small electronics will be free of charge, but some larger electronics (such as TV's) will require you to pay a small fee. Prices for chargeable items is available on at <u>www.westonwi.</u> <u>gov/MayElectronicsRecyclingEvent</u>.

Places like Yaeger Auto Salvage, here in Weston, or Good News Project, in Wausau take electronics year round.



Spring Yard Materials Pick-Up

Spring pick-up of yard waste generally begins the second week of May. Please watch Weston's website and social media sites or call the Village of Weston office closer to that time period for collection updates.

Yard materials can also be taken directly to the Weston Yard Materials Site (located at 8200 Ryan St.), where you can dispose of your yard materials at a time that is convenient to you.

As temperatures warm up during March and April, please DO NOT place materials on the street before the scheduled pickup date. When such materials are placed out too early, they:

- Clog up drainage ways
- Create mold
- Become an environment for rodents to live in
- Cause congestion on roadways

If you are unable to take your yard waste to the Yard Materials Site, Advanced Disposal offers a yard materials pick-up service (for a fee) using a rented 95-gallon cart (similar to the refuse and recycling carts). You can contact Advanced Disposal at 715-359-6637 to learn more about this pick-up service.



Voter registration is required in Wisconsin. How do I register?

- Online during open registration (20 days or more prior to an election) at https://myvote.wi.gov. Must have a current and valid Wisconsin Driver License or Wisconsin State ID card.
- By mail during open registration (20 days or more prior to an election).
- In the Clerk's office (up until the Friday before the election by appointment only).
- In person at your voting location (on Election Day).

You MUST provide proof of residency when registering to vote by mail, in the Clerk's office, or at your voting location. To see which documents are acceptable for proof of residency, please visit <u>https://elections.wi.gov/publications/voter-guides/proof-ofresidency</u>

Three people are running for two vacant positions on the Town of Weston Board this spring. The candidates are:

- Dave Phelps lives on Ross Ave just south of Hwy N with his wife Noel. Dave works at the Neighbors Place as the Food Pantry Director.
- Jim King lives on Gusman Road with his wife Lynn. He is the Maintenance Manager for Greenheck Fan.
- Jared Radcliffe lives on Clearview Drive and works for his family's farming operation as a livestock manager.



Arnie Bauman is retiring after serving 22 years on the board where he oversaw the roads in the town. He also served Marathon County Highway Department for 33 years. The Town of Weston would like to thank Arnie for his many years of service.



Road Projects This Year

The town received a 50 percent grant to rebuild Ross Avenue from Kersten Road to Paul's Avenue. This will be the thirty feet of blacktop and a one-foot shoulder. They are also going to do some ditching on Ross Avenue before the road work is done.

Kramer Lane is going to get a blacktop overlay this summer instead of a complete rebuild. This is because the Village of Weston who owns ½ the road is planning on putting sewer and water down Kramer Lane sometime in the next five years. The Village may be bringing sewer and water under the Eau Claire River from Ryan St to Trotzer Lane sometime this summer or fall.

The Marathon County Alert System
